Highlights from the 2025 Ride Muni to School Week

The first Ride Muni to School week wrapped up with students across the City logging hundreds of transit trips! Thank you to all the students, community members, and SFUSD staff who joined us.

Ride Muni to School week consisted of a ride contest and art contest. Students could participate in the ride contest by logging their transit or yellow school bus trips taken during March 1-9. While trips are still being counted, here are just some exciting initial highlights:

- 19 schools (and counting!) participated
- Students logged 913 transit trips, totaling over 1,700 miles
- The current leading school recorded 294 trips, totaling over 500 miles
- The current leading student logged 167 trips across five agencies, traveling almost 300 miles, over the nine-day contest

Student participants that logged rides and completed challenges will receive prizes, including a Ride Muni to School Week tote bag and an "I ❤️ Muni" notebook.

On March 5, the Safe Routes to School program hosted a lunchtime event at Lincoln High School, where students could learn more about the contests, participate in Muni trivia, get some Muni and SRTS incentives, make their own fruit smoothie on a bike blender, and learn how to place their bike on a bus using a demonstration bus-bike rack donated by Muni.
