## 2025 Bike & Roll to School Week Highlights

Every spring, students across San Francisco use their bikes, scooters, skateboards, wheelchairs and other mobility devices and roll to school together during our annual Bike and Roll to School Week. With support from Safe Routes to School, volunteer Champions host rides to school and other events to celebrate biking and rolling throughout the week.

Thank you to all the parents, SFUSD staff, community members, and students that made the 2025 Bike & Roll to School Week possible!

It was an exciting week for everyone! Our first round of participant data shows:

- Volunteers hosted 50+ events across the city
- 4,500+ students and adults participated
- Routes varied from 4 miles to one block - they all count!
- 2,000 SRTS bike bells were passed out to student participants
- ...and counting!

**One highlight among the Bike and Roll to School Week events:** the McCoppin Elementary School community hosted a morning bike ride from Golden Gate Park on May 7. Over 120 students, parents, and community members biked, rolled, and walked from the half-mile from Music Concourse to school. Students received bike bells, high-visibility vests and healthy snacks, courtesy of SFUSD Nutrition Services, and helped make smoothies on a bike blender. What a great way to start the day!

## 2025 Ride Muni to School Week Art Contest Winners


The first annual Ride Muni to School Week was held March 3-7 and featured a ride contest and art contest. Our prompts for the art contest this year were:

Nani L., École Notre Dame des Victoires




### Middle School

Cesar A., Access SFUSD


